Jacob didn't have a right to do what he did. It was breaking the 7th, 8th, 4th commandment.*

→ The 4th commandment says to honor your parents. What about Rebekah?

Honor = respect and obey

Yet this doesn't mean obeying a wrong command!

Esau did have a right to be angry because Jacob did something ~~unjust~~ unjust.

→ At the same time, REVENGE is wrong → we leave this to God.
